Presentation: Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) Pre-Approved Designs - Tai Williams, Assistant Town Manager, Town of Danville and David Crompton, Assistant Planner

- Garden Cottage Program name of Danville's ADU program. ADU also known as granny flat, carriage house, in-law unit, or casita. Types of ADU: attached, detached, and junior.
- Garden Cottage Program focuses on detached ADUs.
- Three downloadable, permit-ready plans for homeowners to select:
 - o Three sizes: studio (600 sq. ft.), 1 bed/1 bath (800 sq. ft.), 2 bed/1.5 bath (1000 sq. ft.)
 - o Three styles: Mediterranean, Craftsman, and Contemporary
- Why is Town of Danville offering pre-approved ADU plans? It is part of effort to comply with new State ADU and State Housing Laws, and meet market demand.
- Program timeline Started January 2020 with release of RFP/Q for design services and program launched August 2020.
- No disability requirements on private law. Cannot require additional parking (state law).
- No tax benefits and property will be reassess. Connection to utilities charges can be high State law enacted last year reduces fees. Entitlement taxes for schools are also collected. There are exemptions for seniors.
- Housing Element State is asking cities to build more homes at higher density and ADUs are included in the count.
- Financing is an obstacle.
- Danville is the first to offer this type of program in Contra Costa.
- Homeowners can download plans free. City's goal is to approve it within 5 days. Conservative estimate \$50,000 savings to homeowners if they use one of the pre-approved ADU plans.
- Time saving to homeowners: remove planning and public hearing reviews, waive parking requirements, and a general streamline of the permitting process.

Presentation: Center for Elders' Independence (CEI) - Lenore McDonald, Director of Fund Development & Government Relations and Emily Hoshida, CEI Concord Center Director.

• Emily Hoshida has been with CEI for 15 years. She transferred from Alameda County to become Center Director of new Concord site.

- CEI operates PACE (Programs of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly). PACE is a Medicare and MediCal program for aged 55+ who need nursing home level of care. The main objective is to help seniors remain independent.
- Everything is included with no deductibles hospitalizations, rehabilitation, dental, vision, transportation, and prescriptions.
- There are 131 PACE programs in the country.
- PACE is an insurance plan and delivery system.
- Participants: 100% MediCal (85% dual eligible with MediCal/Medicare), 94% live at home, and 4.5 years is the average stay in program.
- CEI has been serving West Contra Costa since 2000.
- Currently has 850 participants enrolled and now has capacity to grow with opening of Concord site. Can now serve up to Stockton border.
- Contracts with language organizations to provide interpretation over phone, Zoom, and on-site.
- Emily Hoshida is working on-site and giving tours of Concord site.
- CEI contracts with John Muir for hospitalizations.
- Another CEI service: Home & Community Based Waiver, an intensive case management program. Serving 400 individuals of all ages in Contra Costa and Alameda.

Update: Home Match, Gabriela Perez, Director

- Received a grant to expand program into Oakland, and doing a soft launch. Gabriela will shift focus to Oakland but will continue to participate in Housing Work Group. Clara Fuchshuber is going to be main contact for Contra Costa.
- City of El Cerrito and is going to be launching an ADU program. For cross-pollination, Home Match will provide brochures and other materials to the El Cerrito ADU program.
- Home Match is in conversation with Concord to renew MOU.

Information Sharing:

- Board of Supervisors passed ordinance to continue tenant protections through June 30, 2021.
- SB-91 extends tenant protections to June 30, 2021.
- Meals on Wheels Diablo Region (MOWDR) received funds to help Antioch residents aged 62+ with rent. Make referrals to Rosa Loya, Case Management Division.
