## NEW MEMBER BIOGRAPHIES

### Adam Poe

Adam is a Staff Attorney with Bay Area Legal Aid's Richmond office. In this role, he provides civil legal services to many clients moving through the reentry process. He brings a plethora of knowledge to the CAB as a direct service provider for the formerly incarcerated, and is an expert in housing law issues. He has long been involved in the County's reentry projects, and well versed in the reentry policy and legislative discussions.

### Angelene Musawwir

Angelene has previously lived in West County, but currently resides in East County. Angelene has been with working for Contra Costa County for almost 10 years as a social worker. She initially worked with Children and Family Services before entering her current position as the AB109 Social Worker for the Public Defender. Not only will Angelene's experience as a social worker in Contra Costa help provide valuable insights, but her intimate knowledge of multiple County agencies will also be of use during important policy discussions.

### Michelle Wells

Michelle Wells is a resident of West County. She is deeply committed to the arts, and uses theater as a tool to promote community development. Her educational and professional pursuits have taken her across the world where she has learned the value of culture in a community. Growing up as a child of an incarcerated parent also gives Michelle a unique perspective to reentry.

### DeVonn Tjader

For almost two decades, DeVonn has engaged in work displaying her commitment to assisting the reintegration of the formerly incarcerated back into society. DeVonn is not only an advocate, but she brings to the CAB a unique experience of being the survivor a violent crime. Her personal experiences and professional accomplishments have combined to help her understand how successful reentry efforts are an effective mechanism to increase public safety. She has an experience in working with a number of different CBO's who have approached reentry issues through different lenses. Because of this she has developed an extensive experience in the areas of low-income housing, mental health, domestic violence, along with substance abuse and recovery to name a few. Currently as the Director of Contract Services with Goodwill Industries she serves on the Alameda County Workforce Investment Board, and also represents her organization on the West County Reentry Resource Center Steering Committee. DeVonn's long history and deep connections with various reentry stakeholders across the Bay Area will certainly add value to the CAB.

### Talia Rubin

Talia brings with her an unwavering commitment to social justice. Through family members she has engaged with multiple county jail systems, and even the state prison. Her experience as the family member of a formerly incarcerated individual certainly colors her approach to her work. Talia is also an expert in various research methodologies. Talia even wrote her master's thesis on the psychological impact of incarceration. She has worked across the state with various organizations on their reentry efforts. Professionally, she is skilled in many things including motivational interviewing, intensive case management, trauma informed care, and DSM diagnostic assessments. Her commitment and professional expertise are of immense value.

### Pat Mims

Pat Mims is a formerly incarcerated individual who now works as the Central County Field Operations Coordinator for Contra Costa's Networked System of Services. Since his release from prison, he has been an advocate for social justice. His previous work with Bay Area Women Against Rape had him leading a program where he assisted sexually exploited minors. As a person who has experienced the difficulties of reentry first hand, and someone deeply involved in the reentry efforts of the County, Pat brings experiences and insights that are hard to rival.
